North Carolina Early Educator Certification (EEC)



You are one of the first in the Nation! It's official!
The NC Institute for Early Childhood Professional Development
has certified just over 6,500 Early Educators

School teachers have it, nurses have it, hair dressers have it, even plumbers have it! Almost all occupations in the United States require their workforce to become certified to be part of the profession. Now Early Educators in North Carolina can have it, too!

Early Educators in North Carolina work with or on the behalf of children ages birth to twelve. An estimated 47,000 of us work with children, assist teachers, teach adult learners, direct programs, monitor funding, provide professional development and technical assistance, provide consultation, direct state programs, work in after-school programs, regulate child care facilities and more.

The Division of Child Development is now funding a new opportunity to expand the Early Educator Certification (EEC) system and provide **free** certification to 9,000 additional applicants! **Please tell your friends so they can take advantage of this opportunity!**

Who is eligible to get certified for free? This grant is open to individuals employed at DCD licensed child care facilities who hold one of the following positions:

- Teacher
- Assistant teacher
- School-age group leader
- Director/administrator
- Assistant director
- Floater
- Education coordinator
- Family child care provider

How can you help NC take the next step toward professionalizing the early childhood workforce? Encourage your friends and co-workers in the field of early childhood education to get certified! While only some people may be eligible for free certification, all individuals working directly with or on behalf of children ages birth to twelve are eligible to apply for EEC.

How does an individual apply to enter the certification system? Individuals need to submit their complete application along with **all official transcripts** to the NC Institute for Early Childhood Professional Development. Applications can be accessed on the web at www.nceec.org.

WORKSHOP DESCRIPTIONS

Family Child Care

Family Child Care Home Pre-Licensing Workshop

This one-day workshop is a comprehensive review of the North Carolina Family Child Care Home Rules and Regulations and will be helpful to persons who are planning to operate a family child care home. The information presented will focus on family child care home licensing information; region specific zoning and sanitation requirements; detailed information regarding program start-up and operation as it relates to budgeting for quality family child care homes.

The Business Side of Child Care

The Business Side of Child Care looks at the basic business issues affecting child care. Topics to be discussed include but are not limited to types of business structures, professionalism, market research, creating of a business plan, customer service, bookkeeping, record-keeping and budgeting. This curriculum covers topics that have been designed to correspond to the same subject areas in N.C. licensing standards for strategies to manage an effective program operation and maintaining a commitment to professionalism.

FCCERS-Family Child Care Environment Rating Scale

This workshop will help child care providers assess their program using the new Family Child Care Rating Scale.

Professionalism for Family Child Care Providers

This workshop will provide information to family home care providers on the importance of presenting themselves and their businesses in a professional way.

Health & Safety

Keep It Clean

Diapering, toileting, hand washing and food preparation are critical aspects of an early childhood classroom. This training will provide tools, resources and techniques to address the underlying knowledge, attitude and behavior of child care providers in these areas.

Child Seat Safety

This course will review the NC laws and regulations regarding the transportation of children specific to the child care industry. Transportation in cars, vans and buses will be covered, with specific child restraint solutions discussed for each.

Fire Safety

This workshop will focus on the state requirements for child care and after-school program compliance for fire safety including exit drills, evacuation procedures and use of fire extinguishers.

Medication Administration (Part 1)

This workshop will provide information on rules and regulations of administering medication in a child care setting. (Participant must attend both sessions to receive full credit.)

Medication Administration (Part 2)

This workshop will provide information on rules and regulations of administering medication in a child care setting. (Participant must attend both sessions to receive full credit.)

Fire Extinguisher Training

This course will review the different types of fire extinguishers, maintenance, and proper use of fire extinguishers. Information will be provided on child care requirements. The class will offer a classroom component and finish with a hand-on application segment.

CPR

This workshop will teach techniques for saving the lives of infants, children and adults. Certification cards will be issued upon completion. *(Certification cards will be mailed to participants 2-3 weeks after completing workshop- Alamance only.)*

First Aid

Keeping children safe is your top priority. Learn how to protect children inside and outside of your child care program, what to do in an emergency, how to stock a first-aid kit, where to call for help and more. *(Certification cards will be mailed to participants 2-3 weeks after completing workshop- Alamance only.)*

ITS SIDS: Infant & Toddler Safe Sleep and SIDS Risk Reduction in Child Care

This workshop gives child care providers an overview of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome, identifies SIDS risk factors and describes ways to reduce the risk of SIDS in child care.

Beyond Band-Aids (Supervision Series)

It's a fact that children at home or in child care will become sick, get hurt or need to take medicine. Dealing with these situations safely is a serious task. This workshop contains guidelines for responding appropriately to accidents and illnesses.

Emergency Preparedness in Child Care

This workshop will help ensure the health and safety of children in child care facilities. Participants will explore the importance of preparing for different types of emergencies and disasters. Providers will learn how to assess their programs' risks and resources, develop and implement a disaster plan, and build a team for effective disaster responses.

Playground Safety

This workshop is designed to promote greater safety awareness and to provide tips for safety on the playground. Strategies and techniques will be shared.

Recognizing and Reporting Child Abuse & Neglect in North Carolina

This workshop will provide information to child care providers on the magnitude of the problem of child abuse and neglect. It will help them to identify signs of abuse and neglect and know the reporting procedures.

Communicable Diseases in Child Care

There are a number of steps which providers and staff of child care homes and centers can take to prevent or reduce the incidents of illness among children and adults in the child care setting. Learn the differences in common infectious diseases and common nuisance diseases.

Inclusion

Services in Wake County for Children Ages 0-5 at Risk for Developmental Delays

This presentation outlines the services in Wake County for children ages 0-5 at risk for developmental delays. Details about various agencies and their role will be discussed..

Infant/Toddler

Infant Toddler Zone (Supervision Series)

This workshop will provide ways to ensure that your environment and procedures will lower the risks of injury, illness, SIDS and other dangers.

Outdoor Learning Environments for Infants and Toddlers

This workshop will teach how to provide age appropriate learning activities for infants in the outdoor environment.

High-Quality Care for Infants and Toddlers: Assessing Your Environment Using the ITERS-Revised

Using pictures from different infant, toddler and two-year-old classrooms, participants will examine the Infant/Toddler Environment Rating Scale and discuss indicators in detail. Emphasis will be placed on ways to use the scale to improve learning environments.

Little People, Big Fun: Planning for Individual Needs

Come explore the many different ways infants and toddlers grow and develop. Participants will learn how to create plans that help support each child's learning and a schedule that works for you and the individual needs of the children in your care.

Language Development and Communication for Infants and Toddlers-(beginner's level)

The participants will learn about the developmental milestones of language for birth to three, the science that links relationships to language learning in the first three years, and strategies to support development in this domain for all children including dual language learners.

Parents/Families

Partnering with Families to Address Challenging Behaviors: We Are All In This Together

This session focuses on developing strategies and skills to make these conversations more productive for everyone...especially the child! Participants will learn how to set the stage for and successfully conduct these difficult conversations with parents.

Preschool

Foundations: Early Learning Standards of NC Preschoolers

This workshop will describe the Early Learning Standards approach of Foundations and the expectations for the learning and development of preschoolers based on guiding principles.

Child Care Provider Almanac (Supervision Series)

All children will present challenging behaviors at one time or another. This module addresses this issue by teaching providers how to develop a plan to interact with children in manner that will prevent misbehavior, promote positive relationships, and guide children to self-control.

Developmentally Appropriate Behavior: But I'm Supposed to Act Like This!

This session focuses on understanding when children can be expected to acquire certain social-emotional skills and guides participants toward understanding, respecting and responding to developmentally appropriate behaviors.

Gateway to Quality: Using the ECERS to transform your preschool classroom

This seminar is designed to help child care providers assess their preschool program using the Early Childhood Environment Rating Scale from the beginner's level to the advanced level. This session will acquaint the provider with the assessment tool and examine fears and misconceptions of having the program assessed. This advanced session will provide in depth information on how to assess your preschool programs using the ECERS-R.

Be Active Kids

This workshop will discuss Be Active Kids, a preschool curriculum full of innovative ideas for teachers who want to increase physical activity, improve nutrition habits and teach children about food safety.

Preventing Challenging Behaviors: An Ounce of Prevention is Worth a Pound of Cure!

This session focuses on modifications teachers can make in six key areas of the environment that will prevent and reduce conflict that leads to challenging behaviors.

Causes of Misbehavior: Why Do They Act That Way?

This session focuses on the common reasons that children misbehave, a crucial first step in determining how to prevent/reduce challenging behaviors.

Behavior Intervention Strategies: You Want Me to Try What?

This workshop focuses on helping participants develop new responses to challenging behaviors using six key intervention strategies.

School-Age

BSAC: Basic School-Age Care

(Cost includes manual, handouts and dinner- Alamance County only)

This workshop provides comprehensive, basic training for providers with school-age children. Some of the modules that will be taught are: Quality School-Age Care; Positive Behavior Management; Age-appropriate Activities; Health, Safety and Nutrition; and Child Care Requirements and Regulations.

SACERS- School-Age Environment Rating Scale

This workshop will train child care providers in assessing group care programs for school-age children (5-12 yrs) using the School-Age Care Rating Scale.

Other Topics

Professionalism in the Workplace: What Not to Wear

This workshop will address being professional and communicating a positive message with your image everyday in the workplace.

Busting the Myths: Professional Development Seminar

Child care providers will learn how to utilize the NC Institute for Early Childhood Professional Development Plan to guide their continued education and early childhood careers. Professionals from local colleges will be present to assist as needed.

What Pushes Your Buttons?

This workshop gives child care providers the opportunity to examine attitudes and responses to challenging behaviors in the classroom. All providers experience different behaviors that might "push their buttons." Please be prepared to share the behavior that irritates you the most, and together as a group we will work on developing a better understanding and strategies to help you to deal with these behaviors

Sliding Fee Scale and Scholarship Programs

This workshop will explain the policies developed by the Division of Child Development about sliding fee scale and scholarship programs. Documentation required to support your financial assistance program will be discussed, and information to support families who struggle with the cost of child care will also be shared.

Supervision of Children

This workshop will provide ways to ensure that your environment and your procedures will lower risks from injury, illness and other dangers.

Social/Emotional Milestones: Responsive Caregiving and Development of Identity

This workshop discusses the topic of how caregivers form sensitive and responsive relationships with each child. Guidelines for promoting and supporting positive social and emotional development are presented. The three steps in the responsive process are discussed as well as the ten care-giving gifts required to support the child's social and emotional development

Ready, Set, Go: Guide to Kindergarten Transition

This workshop will provide transition activities for children birth through age five.

Tools for Preventing Challenging Behaviors

This workshop will provide child care professionals the opportunity to examine their daily practices with the focus on how those practices affect the behavior of the 3-, 4-, and 5-year-old children in their classrooms. We will explore how to build positive relationships, create interesting environments and include social emotional-teaching strategies on a daily basis.

Basic Computer Training

This workshop will help providers learn the basic skills needed for taking online classes to further their education. They will learn how to navigate through e-mail and the Internet.

Basic Computer Training for Adult Learners (Part 1 & 2)

Participants will learn the fundamentals of computer technology in this beginning level class. They will learn how computers operate and learn basic Microsoft applications, including Windows, Word, and how to access the enormous amount of information available on the Internet.

Quality Child Care: What parents are looking for

This training will focus on quality child care and what parents are told to look for when searching for a child care center/home for their child. Participants will learn what makes a center/home quality child care as well as how to present themselves and their program to a perspective parents.

Placement Test Study

This workshop will help potential students to pass the placement test in reading, writing and math to further their education.

Creating Lesson Plans

This workshop will focus on creating lesson plans that will address the eleven center areas and how children develop and learn through developmental appropriate lesson plans.

Listening and Talking

This training will focus on helping children understand and use language; using books; books and pictures; encouraging children to communicate; using language to develop reasoning skills; and informal use of language. Strategies will be shared that can be implemented while working with infants-preschool children.

Basic Math Skills for Adult Learners (2 parts)

This course is designed to strengthen basic math skills. Topics include rounding, estimating, comparing, converting, and computing whole numbers, fractions and decimals. Upon completion, participants should be able to perform basic computations and solve relevant mathematical problems.
